



Callaway Golf Staff Professional Annika Sorenstam Wins Fifth Major in Dramatic Playoff Using Great Big Bertha II Driver and HX Red Golf Ball

CARLSBAD, Calif.--(BUSINESS WIRE)--June 9, 2003--Callaway Golf (NYSE: ELY) Staff Professional Annika Sorenstam added another major championship to her impressive collection by winning the McDonald's LPGA Championship yesterday. Sorenstam's tap-in par on the first hole of a sudden-death playoff secured the fifth major championship of her Hall-of-Fame career and her fourth international victory of the 2003 season. The victory was also the second in as many weeks on the LPGA Tour after Sorenstam's historic appearance on the PGA Tour at the Bank of America Colonial.

"Winning is what it's all about," said Sorenstam, who played a total of 34 holes on Sunday at the rain-plagued event. "At the Colonial it was about the journey to winning, and I learned so much that week. Maybe all that pressure I experienced is what helped me to win today."

Sorenstam was one of two players to finish the McDonald's LPGA Championship under par, carding a 6-under-par 278 in regulation play at Dupont Country Club. Sorenstam used 11 Callaway Golf(R) clubs at the event, including a Great Big Bertha(R) II Pro Series Titanium Driver, a Big Bertha(R) Steelhead(TM) III 7-wood, Steelhead X-14(R) Irons and an Odyssey(R) White Hot(R) 2-Ball Putter, along with the Company's HX(R) Red golf ball. Sorenstam also wore shoes from the new Callaway Golf Footwear Collection. Sorenstam has now won three times on the LPGA Tour this season and a total of four times in the eight women's events she has played around the world this year.

A victory at the upcoming British Women's Open would give Sorenstam all four legs of the modern LPGA Tour Grand Slam. She already has a pair of victories at both the U.S. Women's Open and the Nabisco Championship. Sorenstam leads the LPGA Tour in numerous statistical categories again this year, including scoring average, money won, greens hit in regulation, driving distance average and player of the year points.

Callaway Golf equipment also played a major role in a victory on the Nationwide Tour yesterday. Andre Stolz came from behind to win the LaSalle Bank Open for this third international victory of the year. Stolz used a Great Big Bertha II Pro Series Titanium Driver, Steelhead III Strong 4-wood and the CTU 30(R) Blue golf ball to win his first title on U.S. soil this year. Stolz has also won using Callaway Golf clubs and balls on the Australasian and Japan Golf Tours in 2003.
